



MY MISSION STORY: GLADIS AGUIRIANO

My name is Gladis Aguiriano. I am actually working as community development coordinator for Carolina Honduras Health Foundation in Limón County, Honduras (where the clinic is located). I work with prevention health issues including the recycling and chimney projects, the medical referral program and developing resources for the community. It is a real privilege to be part of this wonderful project and can help the most needed people of my communities.

It is amazing how we can live in a same place but being blind. Working with CHHF has given me the opportunity to see things from a different point of view and to grow as a human being. CHHF has given me the opportunity to change in a very positive way. ***You all have changed my life.***

Today, I want to share with you a story that real touch my heart. I still remember as if it happened yesterday when Lidia came into the clinic telling us that Jesser was really bad. We immediately told her to bring him into the clinic to be seen by our doctors. *You cannot imagine how bad Jesser was.* He was having seizures attack and was unconscious. It was about noon time and Lidia said he started having seizures since 10 am. However, she had to wait until her husband get permission at his work to bring Jesser to the clinic. They live in Plan de Flores – a town about 30 minutes away from Limón.

Immediately the doctors came to help him. They did what they could but Jesser did not react so the Dra. Rosa told us to call the ambulance because he must go to the hospital as soon as possible. I called the ambulance. It took about 15 minutes to the ambulance to come.

We put Jesser and his mom in the ambulance and send him to San Isidro Hospital at Tocoa. Once they left the clinic, I went to talk with the doctor to know the situation and she said we must believe and pray to God. It will be a miracle if Jesser get alive to the hospital. I remember I started tearing and I pray to God to bless that child and give him an opportunity to live. The doctor told me that his lungs were collapsing and all his body was literally not responding. The only movement we saw were because of the constant seizures attack.

I keep calling the ambulance driver to check if Jesser was alive. Once they got to the hospital, the ambulance driver call me to let me know they were already at the hospital. Glory to God Jesser got alive to the hospital. ***We keep believing in miracles.*** Everybody keep asking about Jesser.



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In the evening Lidia called me to let me know Jesser reacted but they were sending them to San Pedro Sula (a large town about 3 hours from Limón). He must be seen by a neurologist doctor and the closest, one we have in Honduras is in San Pedro Sula (if not the only one).

Through the medical referral program, CHHF helped them to bring Jesse to San Pedro Sula. They stay in the hospital until Jesser got better.

A week later Jesser and his mom Lidia came to my house to give me his report (all the paper that the doctor let her to keep). It was just unbelievable. **A week before I saw that little boy almost dying (and I can tell you that if we were not in the clinic that day he would be dead because nobody else was going to help that poor baby and family) and that day he came into my house saying: “hola” and giving me a huge hug.** I can't tell you how I feel at that moment but I could not stop my tears. I felt my heart to become tight and I thanked God because if I didn't believe in miracles, *Jesser is a miracle.*



Jesser is a boy that have given me a huge lesson. He keep fighting and trying hard every day. And I admire Lidia. She is a warrior mom. She is always fighting and doing everything is in her hands to help her child.

When I met him he was a very hyperactive boy. It was normal that he was running, screaming, jumping or biting someone. He never stay quiet or behave. He always was doing something. Through the time we have been helping this family (CHHF has been providing them to keep the appointment with the neurologist and pediatric doctors and medications Jesser needs) he is becoming better-behaved boy.

Now I can talk with him. He comes to my house hugging my girls. He comes in and gives me hugs and ask me how I am. He also answer any question I ask to him. He is becoming more alert and developing his understanding. He is a smart boy that deserve a better life.



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Seeing Jesser growing is a blessing. I can tell you – You are the real heroes. You have save Jesser´s life. You are giving Jesser the opportunity to enjoy this world and to know the wonderful of God.

Jesser is growing and becoming a handsome boy every single day because of the power of God and your support.

What you are doing for our people and for kids like Jesser is priceless. We all are very grateful because you are making a huge difference in the life of every kids in our program. You are giving them the opportunity of living, of growing and becoming a better human being. You are being the hands of God and are showing our Honduras brothers and sister that there are hope. That God loves us and that you are our angels sent by God.
